What would you like to do?

The Llangennech & Bryn Sports Association (LBSA) originated as a people-led community interest group, establishing as a CIO in 2019. The LBSA was formed to strengthen connections between previously fractious community sports clubs and other establishments, who used to clash over available community spaces. We have since created strong bonds and live by our motto, "strengthening the community". The LBSA has recently gained responsibility for the maintenance of the recreation ground sports field from the Community Council. We aim to convert the area into a community facility worthy of hosting sports clubs as well as a safe play zone for the local playschool located within the grounds. This would involve replacing the corroded rugby posts, purchasing a new line marker, and enclosing the field to eliminate the current dog fouling issues from irresponsible dog walkers. As well as the above issue positively effecting the whole community, the project would make an obvious difference to the rugby and football clubs with much needed new long term equipment, while the fence would allow for a potential space for local businesses to place sponsor boards, helping the LBSA to generate revenue to reinvest in further facility development. The fence would also provide the local playschool with a new, enclosed space for children to play, clear of dog mess and other hazards. We aim to maintain the facility for an indefinite period, while we have a strong social media presence and increasing following on Facebook and Twitter to promote all activity. We also have a website where all developments, correspondence and news are posted to ensure transparency to the public. This project would cue the setting up of dedicated Instagram & YouTube accounts. This is a new venture and would certainly help raise our profile and launch number of other projects we have planned.

How does your project meet at least one of our funding priorities?

Since 2018, the LBSA connected six sports clubs within its area and has had a key role to encourage a 30% growth in participation in sport across young and old, including veterans' football. The Ysgol Meithrin, cricket, rugby and football clubs will gain from the funding of this project as it will make the recreation field bigger to create more space for activity, and allow more children's teams to play simultaneously, including plans for a girls team, while taking away use of the neighbouring cricket pitch outfield during winter, allowing for the condition of that surface to improve during its months of rest. Said clubs have taken steps to continue to provide an outlet for their members via the work of people involved with the LBSA throughout the pandemic. There has been recognition in that time that coming together to achieve self-sufficiency is a key aim for any future challenges.

How does your project involve your community?

The LBSA was initially set up as a people-led community group and there was constant dialect via WhatsApp, our website and Facebook where older, middle and younger people of the community contributed to ensure we gauged the needs of the people regarding the project. We also maintain regular contact with CAVS for support and advice. The charity committee involves people from the rugby, football, netball and playschool clubs and establishments, as well as the general community. The WhatsApp group involves official members of the charity committee and community councillors, also members of the local cricket, badminton, cycling and netball clubs, along with members of the public. Regular meetings were held prior to the Covid-19 pandemic. However, the pandemic has stunted the ability to run the regular community fundraising events since, whereby we have had to cancel at least 6 events that we had forecast 20/21 to bring in some £2500-3000 of revenue. We always look to set up focus groups for each of our projects, currently done via Zoom; this project involves three liaison officers from various backgrounds to deal with the maintenance contractor. We continue to aim to raise our profile via social media as best we can.
