Thanks for the copy letter received from the above which refers to the future maintenance of the pitch and also to brief statements regarding grant applications. Unfortunately, the LBSA have not explained their overall objectives and how these fit into the constraints that apply in the way that this Park has to be managed. In reality, what may be ultimately proposed could be unacceptable to the Council, particularly relating to fencing - THE PARK IS HELD IN TRUST FOR THE BENEFIT OF ALL THE COMMUNITY- fencing could equally be requested for the Cricket Outfield. The provision of any further buildings is very problematic on this flood plain and should be resisted.

You will recall the previous proposals relating to:

1. An area in the vicinity of the Tennis Court involving the provision of an enclosed sports area.
2. The corner plot in the south west corner of the park for training purposes.
3. The provision of a Junior Pitch at Cae Pwynd.

There was insufficient information submitted in respect of (1) above and a very rude response when essential information was requested by Council Officers.

In respect of (2) & (3) approval was granted, in principle, by the Council. Nothing further seems to have happened regarding these schemes.

The only information that is currently available follows from verbal comments made by a LBSA representative at our previous Council Meetings which, as I recall, mentioned arrangements for future maintenance, dog fouling and fencing of the football pitch and some brief comment about an additional building - THE COUNCIL HAS NO FURTHER INFORMATION IN THIS RESPECT. Finally, there is advantage in the Council retaining its responsibility for the maintenance of the football pitch and for considering any suggestions for improving this regime in discussion with the LBSA which have an important part to play in that respect. In addition, accountability for employing Contractors and the financial controls involved in handling public money is onerous and best left to the Council in these circumstances.
