Please describe the overall aims and objectives of your organisation and the activities or services your organisation provides

The Llangennech and Bryn Sports Association (Cymdeithasfa Chwaraeon Llangennech a Bryn) is a community group registered as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), as recognised by the Charities Commission of England and Wales.

Known as the LBSA, we are a community group with the participation of volunteer members who commonly support the aims of the group and its activities. The LBSA has diverse membership from contributors across the community. The LBSA will serve to seek potential opportunities to improve the facilities of the under-utilised spaces available to the community, and leave a legacy that following generations will reap the benefits of.

The initial programme is aimed at the development of two communal areas of land within the community, and applying for relevant grants available to secure funding and guidance on implementing the installation of new multipurpose training / junior playing facilities. The facilities shall then be managed by the LBSA, i.e. hire fees (if applicable), scheduled usage, maintenance programme, etc.

Longer term plans would be to explore and attain further land within the community to utilise the spaces and seek funding to construct and manage facilities to improve and encourage participation in sport as well as health and well-being activities, and improving public spaces.

The aims of the LBSA is to bring together and improve relations among different sports, education and social organisations within the Llangennech & Bryn community. We aim to promote participation in recreational activities, mutual support and joint aid among our members. The LBSA also aims to establish sports clubs and participate in different sporting activities, while sharing ideas associated with improving community sporting facilities. We will also organise fundraising events to aid development of facilities and participation and explore funding opportunities in order to improve grass roots facilities, while working with the relevant funding bodies.

Please give a brief summary on your project

The LBSA aim to redirect the path at a local unused parkland in order to aid development of junior / community sports playing / training field.

Please describe your project in further detail, explaining how it meets the criteria

Brynhyfryd Park - as part of our research of land owned and maintained by the community council, we feel this is one key area that could be better utilised by allowing the association to suggest some changes.

We feel that it could easily be transformed into a junior sports playing field. There is a 60m x 40m footprint - ample space for a field to be marked for ages up to Under 11, for both rugby and football use. The outlined area is on a slight gradient and the surface does get soggy, but we view it as another option to ease the burden on the overused park field and to keep games away from the cricket outfield. The obvious obstruction is the footpath running through the land and across the corner of the proposed playing field. Redirecting the path around is what we propose and hope the community council will agree to.

This would improve a rural environment while also encouraging healthier and more active people and communities. This would also preserve heritage and culture of the community by regenerating a derelict park land that was once a thriving hub of the community.

Please give a brief outline on how you intend to spend the grant inline with the criteria

The grant would part fund the entire cost of the project, for which we have had quotes in the region of £5,000. This would be in order to dig up the current pathway, replace with soil and grass seed and redirect the path from a specific point (as seen in the attached photograph) in order to create enough space to make a mini training / playing football /rugby field that would reduce over usage of the current available area and also lead to regeneration of the us of the park for the entire community.

Please explain how you know that the project is needed and what evidence you have collected to demonstrate this

A report was produced for the land owners (community council) which included details of quotes to dig up and relay the asphalt path, a car parking survey, enquiry to county council regarding confirmation of any requirement for planning permission to carry out the work. Also there was research into the improved maintenance programme for the potential pitch.

What changes would this grant make to the lives of people who will attend this project/service?

There is a lack of playing space in Llangennech and Bryn for football and rugby. At present, the only place large enough to host under 10 and 11 football matches is Llangennech Recreation Ground. Llangennech RFC also have the option of using their owned ground as well as Llangennech School.

The lack of available space for football matches in particular creates a logistical problem for organising matches. The under 10 and 11 age groups have to fit in around the older age group matches who have to take priority due to league rules. Both sports clubs have ambitions to increase the number of teams that they run. Playing space is a crucial factor in their development.

A dedicated 60 x 40 yards mini sports pitch will also take some pressure off other venues, especially Llangennech Recreation Ground, leading to less maintenance problems. The health benefits of this project are potentially huge.

We are aware that childhood obesity is rising and keeping children active is a common objective for the LBSA. The dedicated pitch for these age groups will lead to more matches for them and therefore more physical activity.

Please explain how you will measure and report on the changes made?

We already have a fine record of research and detailed exploration of our projects an the aftermath of the development would heed a similar approach in order to prove the need for the work as we had appealed in the first place. This will no doubt be a requirement of the community council in order to aid their record of supporting local improvements to public spaces. we have an open approach to recording all our activities via our website timeline of events in order to publicise all developments and imagine this would be an outlet to detail report the changes as they develop as well as our social media existence via Twitter and Facebook. Upon completion of the project, we would ensure exposure via our contacts at press and media outlets and complete a full chapter on our website that would be linked to our social media accounts and promoted by all our affiliated clubs and members.

We will continue to hold events throughout the year and also apply for partner funding from various trusts.

Project budget breakdown summary (Inc. VAT)

The grant would completely go toward the overall cost of the main construction project involved with developing the field by the simple redirection of the asphalt path. The best estimate we have for this work is £4260, however this was March 2019.

The quote is as follows:

Excavate the existing path and dispose of all excavated material.

Excavate and construct a new pathway at a different location.

Use as much as possible of earth excavated from new area to fill in the existing path which will have been excavated.

Supply and lay a 100mm layer of sub base type 1 hard-core into new path.

Supply and lay a 50mm layer of binder course macadam and a 25mm layer of 6mm wearing course

macadam over the new area (50 sq metres).

The total cost of carrying out this work is £ 3550 + vat.
