As discussed at tonight's meeting,

Recent vandalism and damage at the Recreation Ground:

There was an Agreement between cricket and football clubs to store goals behind aris fencing while the CC carried out their building work. Unfortunately, kids had taken out and destroyed the goals. They were found behind the hedge. On another day, some teens had also broken off the new padlock and chain, and it remains missing. The clubs have now found a short term solution to the storage of said equipment, so they are inaccessible to be vandalised for now.

The ongoing question over CCTV was raised again, but in the short term the football club suggested an alternative measure of prevention. So the LBSA are seeking permission to install a permanent goal fixture at the south end, behind the hedge, for the general public to use.

This will hopefully present those who are keen to have some goals to shoot at with a solution, while deterring the vandalism. We'd look to source solid materials for it, to ensure it is a robust instalment and help prevent any vandalism to it. One idea is that we could find a local business to sponsor the supply and fabrication of some scaffold poles. The idea is that goals would be 6ft high by 12ft wide and concreted in with post mix or similar. We could even look into making a combination goal (rugby posts on top of football crossbar, see the attached picture as an example - ours would be on a smaller scale with posts not too high, perhaps 9ft). Paint them white. (We probably wouldn't go to the expense of attaching nets). All in all, very similar to what currently exists at Cae Pownd in Brynhyfryd.



So, could we please have permission to erect something of that kind, to discourage the vandalism and damage to equipment that all comes at cost to our clubs?
