To begin, for your reference, the following attended the initial LBSA meeting on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of March 2020 and agreed to an LBSA proposal to be put forward to the Community Council regarding Llangennech Park's Playing Field.

Following some further research into matters and delays due to the pandemic, you'll recall this was what was initially discussed in the Community Council meeting of December 2020.

We received the requested correspondence regarding the previous "application" letter by the Cricket Club to attain a license, just for guidance. It helped to clarify some questions we had surrounding the maintenance arrangements and, following further research and talks with the long-serving members of the Cricket Club committee, it became apparent that a license was not required to be held in order to take ownership of the maintenance programme of the pitch as we had previously believed. However, the letter does offer a guide as to the standard of information we would be expected to impart in future, when the time comes for us to attain the required license to support any grant aid application.

Following a meeting with Carmarthenshire Association of Volunteer Services' (CAVS) representative Jackie Dorrian on January 5<sup>th</sup>, 2021 the LBSA are now pursuing various new avenues for potential grant aid via the National Lottery's *Awards For All* scheme, among others. The details of these funding applications will follow a period of engagement with the community and the issues raised.

As for the January 11<sup>th</sup> Council meeting, we request that the Councillors grant us permission to arrange for the LBSA to take ownership of the Recreation Ground maintenance, as per the Cricket Club's agreement. Namely - as confirmed by the correspondence received from officers Eric Lewis, Keith Thomas and Huw Thomas of the Cricket Club - the LBSA shall supply the council with an annual statement of accounts and copies of all invoices of expenditure, and the council shall cover the costs, to an agreed budget. We intend to use the current contractor to carry out all works (DND) and we propose this agreement be implemented in time for the new financial year.
